This program offers students a unique zoo experience in which they get an opportunity to learn and practise scientific skills of observing animal behaviour, designing and implementing enrichment devices that will help encourage natural behaviours in captive animals.



Project Site:

Zoo Negara, Kuala Lumpur

Just a 20-minute drive from Kuala Lumpur, the capital city of Malaysia, the National Zoo is almost 50 years old and sits on 110 acres of land boasting over 5,100 animals of 459 species of mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish.

Zoo Negara Malaysia is managed by the Malaysian Zoological Society, a non-governmental organization established to create the first local zoo for Malaysians.

Zoo Negara has successfully bred milky storks, false gharials, pheasants and giraffes.

Programme:

2 days, 0830 hours – 1700 hours



DAY 1

- Welcome & Introduction to programme
- Zoo Tour
- Animal Observation: Orangutan, Sun bear and Chimpanzee
- Design and prepare Enrichment for observed animals
- Personal impact: Students work at husbandry, painting, design of posters in different areas across the zoo

DAY 2

- Installation of enrichment in the exhibit followed by observation activity
- Personal impact – work started the previous day is completed and displayed
- Social survey- interviews of zoo visitors and zoo keepers
- Interpretation: Compare, Discuss, Discover and Display. Collective analysis and synthesis of learnings.
- Zoos in Conservation – presentation by the zoo

Programme Cost: RM 300 per student/ teacher
